

Treasurer's Report: Reports for August were reviewed by Chip Haak. Giving took a downward turn. Also, the rent for 216 was not received until September. On the Expense side we had large payments for rental property taxes totaling \$4,500. The combination of low giving and the high expenses resulted in Net Loss for August of \$-10,953. That erased our YTD Income to a Net Loss of \$-188.

Financial Secretary's Report: The August report was <u>presented. Denny also noted the low giving, however, so far in September the giving is better.</u>

We have (4) youth attending "Alive" a Synod Youth event for Jr. High kids and they will be chaperoned by Mark and Danielle Mariano. Pastor will attend Friday night to assist with acclimation.

The choir has returned and is practicing at 9am prior to the Service. There are plans for handbell choir to return as well.

With the significant cost associated with the prepackaged Communion elements, Pastor would like Council's thoughts on how we might return to using regular glasses. We would still have the prepackaged elements for those who need them at home.
