In the Christian Church, the season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 22. Lent is a season of 40 days of preparation before Easter when many Christians observe a period of fasting, repentance, moderation, self-denial and spiritual discipline. The purpose is to set aside time for reflection on Jesus Christ—his suffering and his sacrifice, his life, death, burial, and resurrection. Lent is a matter of the heart, as we are encouraged to consider our faith and the priorities of our hearts.

As we worship together on Ash Wednesday, we use the ancient practice of imposition of ashes as we hear the words, "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return." Ashes symbolize several aspects of our human existence: Ashes are an external mark of our mortality and the acknowledgement of the reality of the power of sin in our lives. We are reminded of God's condemnation of sin as God said to Adam, "Dust you are and to dust you shall return." (Genesis 3:19). Ashes suggest cleansing and renewal. In ancient days with the absence of soap, ashes were used for cleansing. The shape reminds us of the cross traced on our foreheads as we are baptized. Even in the midst of our need for cleansing and repentance, we anticipate the promise of new life found in the empty tomb of Easter. Ashes remind us of our mortality and the shortness of our human lives.

Ashes are a symbol of our need to repent, confess our sins, and return to God.

The word Lent is a shortened form of the Old English word "Lencten", meaning "spring season". As we share these 40 days, it is good to remember that the meaning behind the word Lent is "spring." After the many weeks of winter, we have this gift of being reminded that we are heading to spring. As the sunlight lasts a little longer each day, we know that warmer days are coming. The flower bulbs and buds of spring will soon break through the ground to remind us of new life.

Each Wednesday of the season of Lent we will invite you to share a soup supper followed by Evening Prayer worship. Please join us for worship on February 22 as we share the liturgy of Ash Wednesday and begin our Lenten journey through these 40 days of contemplation of God's great love for us all.

Congregational Meeting—February 26th


On **Sunday, February 26th**, we will hold our Congregational meeting. Your Annual Report will be distributed to you near the beginning of February.

Some of their programs include Help Ministries, Prison Action Committee, Susquehanna Harbor Safe Haven, The Bridge Food Pantry and other programs where they partner with others.

Susquehanna Harbor Safe Haven provides housing for homeless men with mental illness. They can always use the following items: twin size sheet sets, new pillows, pine sol cleaner, dish and laundry soap, dressers, end tables, night stands, desk lamps and table lamps and under-bed storage containers.


