The Congregation Council Meeting was called to order at 7:03pm by President JoEllen Myers

I.Reports:

- **a.** Treasurer's Report: Reports for January were reviewed by Stephanie Gross. Giving for month was very good. The Net Income was \$7,416. Largest expense was for Property Insurance of \$2,260.
- b. Financial Secretary's Report: The January report was presented. Denny had no additional comments.
- c. Secretary's Report: The minutes from the January 24, 2023, Council meeting were presented.
- **d.** Pastor's Report: Report for January 25,- February 21, 2023, was emailed to members prior to meeting and reviewed by Pastor.
- e. Correspondence: Thank you for financial support:
 - i. Hershey Food Bank-\$1,000 (Extended Ministries)
 - ii.Lutheran World Relief-Quilt & kits shipping-\$375.09
 - iii. Lutheran World Relief-\$1,452.00
 - iv. Love INC-\$1,000 (Extended Ministries)
- f. Ministry Teams:
 - Youth Committee: Steve Cameron has resigned as chair after many years of service. Danielle
 Mariano has agreed to serve in this capacity. The Committee will be renamed to Youth and Faith Formation.
 - ii. Property Committee: Minutes from 02/07/23 meeting were presented.
 - iii. Faith In Action: Rodney Gross reported that the Lenten Food drive is underway.
 - iv. Audit Committee: Report from February 4th included in Council packet. No issues identified.
 - v. **Finance Committee:** Minutes from 2/17/23 meeting were presented.
 - 1. Extended Ministries Committee Budget
 - **i. Recommendation** Set Extended Ministries budget for 2023 at approximately 3% of the Unrestricted Endowment fund, at a value of \$25,000.
 - A motion to approve recommendation by Mark Mariano, second by Beth Dunham. Motion approved by Council.
 - 2. MIF CD renewal on March 13, 2023:
 - i. Recommendation Withdraw this CD at term end and return to the Unrestricted Endowment Fund
 - A motion to approve recommendation by Mark Mariano, second by Susan Bianchi. Motion approved by Council.
 - Note: After this withdrawal we will have (3) remaining CDs in the ELCA Mission Investment Fund, and no further withdrawals are planned.
 - 3. Heating and Cooling Project:
 - i. Chip provided an overview based on the four options and the recommendation outlined in the Finance Committee minutes.
 - ii. Recommendation Option 1: Finance the project This would provide access to cash as its needed. In turn, it would require a fixed repayment plan. This would effectively spread the cost over 5-10 years with an added origination cost and interest payments. While these added costs will depend on the actual amount borrowed, the interest rate, loan term, and repayment schedule, this option would likely add \$6,000 (origination fees) and then approximately \$30,000 over the next five years (assuming a five year term, 10% interest rate, and \$100,000). Finance would research the best available rate with options such as a MIF Loan, Home Equity Line of Credit, Business Loan, etc.
 - iii. Based on this recommendation the following *motions* were made by Rodney Gross, second by Mark Mariano.
 - 1. Proceed with main floor bathrooms conversion (Phase 1).
 - a. Costs should be paid from cash currently available in the Capital Projects account at Bryn Mawr Trust.

- 2. Proceed with replacement, upgrade, and expansion of Sanctuary heating and cooling systems. (Phase 2).
 - a. Costs for Phase 2, related engineering/design costs, and permit costs should be paid from cash available in Capital Projects at Bryn Mawr Trust and the money market Capital Repair Fund.
 - i. In the event that there is not sufficient money available, then we authorize the Church Council to secure financing for the remainder not to exceed \$125,000.

Motions 1 & 2 Approved by Council, and forwarded to Congregation for approval at February 26, 2023, meeting.



He will be our congregational resource supporting the outdoor ministry programs at Camp Kirchenwald, Camp Nawakwa, and the Wittel Farm. The goal is to promote camp activities and encourage all members of all ages to take advantage of the outdoor ministries offered through the Lutheran Camping Corporation of Central Pennsylvania.

Rodney, Stephanie and their daughters have been involved with camp for many years. Stephanie worked on staff for a year and was a counselor to young campers for two years while in high school and college. 

Holy Trinity - Faith In Action Food Bank Activity for Lent 2023

Can you guess the weight of supplies?

Here is a challenge for Lent this year to help the ministry of the Hershey Food Bank and Community Outreach and our neighbors by donating items for the Hershey Food Bank!



Lent began February 22 with Ash Wednesday. The idea is to put one item in your bag during the 40 days of Lent. Monetary donations are also accepted with checks made payable to the "Hershey Food Bank." **Sorting & packing will take place on Sunday, April 23rd after the 10 AM service.** You will find a sheet in the bag to write your donations on each day of Lent to add some fun as you collect your items

Here's a list of different things food banks need, but rarely ask for:

- Unusual canned items -like lima beans, spinach, pickles, green olives, asparagus
- Canned fruit of all kinds—Their clients love it when fruit is available.
- Pasta and Rice Side dishes.
- Small bags of beans, lentils, etc.
- Canned frosting for cakes
- Spices—Think about it. People who rely on the food bank eat a lot of canned food, rice, oatmeal, white bread, etc. They love spices. Seasoned salt, cayenne pepper, chili powder, cumin, cinnamon, nutmeq, allspice, oregano, basil and so on.
- Chocolate—People don't need it but think about being in their shoes and how nice it would be to be given a chocolate bar or brownie mix along with your essentials.
- Toiletries—Grocery stores are great about donating surplus or unsold food, but they
 have no reason to donate toilet paper, paper towels, tissues, toothpaste, soap, deodorant, shampoo, etc.
- Crackers and tortillas—They don't spoil, and everybody likes them.
- Baby toiletries—Diapers (especially sizes 2 thru 6), baby wipes, baby formula, baby shampoo, baby soap, bottles, etc.
- Soup packets—Sometimes you look at rice, beans, instant potatoes, and cans of vegetable and think, "What do I make with this?" Hearty soup is a complete meal.
- Peanut butter is a great source of protein and a favorite for kids. Imagine a hot bowl of soup and a PB&J sandwich on a cold winter day.
- Feminine Products—Imagine being worried about affording these. Pads, tampons, panty liners, etc.

The Kid's Page

Use batik, a unique fabric-dving method. to create flags celebrating the good news of Christ's resurrection.




What you need:


- Colored chalk
- White linen fabric
- Washable gel glue
- Acrylic craft paint
- Textile medium
- Paintbrushes

What you do:

- 1. Cut fabric to the desired size and shape. Set it on a flat, protected surface. With chalk, lightly sketch an Easter design or message.
- 2. Completely cover the chalk lines with gel glue. Let dry.
- 3. Mix equal parts paint and textile medium. Paint the flag with that mixture, which makes paint permanent. Let dry.
- 4. Soak the dried fabric in warm water a few minutes. Then gently peel away the glue to reveal the unpainted areas. Lay flat to dry.
- 5. Hang the flags and celebrate!
