2 There's a song in ev'ry silence, seeking word and melody; there's a dawn in ev'ry darkness, bringing hope to you and me. From the past will come the future; what it holds, a mystery, unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see.

Each year, as spring dawns around us, I think of this hymn by Natalie Sleeth. As the sun of spring warms the earth, we see the grass turn green and flowers bursting forth from the ground from the bulbs that laid dormant during the cold winter months. The Congregation Council Meeting was called to order at 7:03pm by President JoEllen Myers

Reports:

- **Treasurer's Report:** Reports for February were reviewed by Stephanie Gross. Giving for month was down. Some repair bills, Christmas flowers, and moving the piano impacted routine expenses. Net Loss for the month -\$1,108 but year to date is still positive at \$6.308.
- Financial Secretary's Report: The February report was presented.

Secretary's Report:

Minutes from the February 21, 2023, Council meeting were presented.

Minutes from the Annual Congregation Meeting, February 26, 2023.

Pastor's Report: Report for February 22, - March 21, 2023, was emailed to members prior to meeting. Pastor had spent the earlier part of the day at the Bishop's retreat at Camp Nawakwa.

Ministry Teams:

Faith In Action: Rodney Gross reported that the Lenten Food drive continues.

Had to make more bags because already used 50 that were initially created.

April 23rd will be day for packing and lunch.

Other projects for FIA are under discussion.

Welcoming Task Force: Ethan Ellenberger reported that they are targeting May 7th for Congregation vote on becoming a Reconciling in Christ congregation.

Unfinished Business:

- Synod Assembly Delegates-Needed for June 2 & June 3rd. Susan Bianchi volunteered, and Mark Mariano will check availability. May 20th Edification Day (online)
- HVAC and Restroom renovations: Chip Haak provided update from Property Committee meeting held earlier in the day.

Request for building permits has been submitted to the Township.

The timeline for the start of projects is late April or early May.

Karen Kline has developed a "preparation checklist" for each of the rooms which will be impacted so items in the rooms, like nursery, can be either be moved or cleaned out. PreK room will be a temporary storage area.

Also, Phase 3 "updates to the lighting and controls" which has not been approved or scheduled has become a concern as one of the modules has failed. A workaround is in place to turn the lights on; however, the reliability of the system is suspect.

Using Internet Explorer, Edge, Google Chrome, or Mozilla Firefox, you can quickly clear your cache with a keyboard shortcut.

While using your browser, **press Ctrl+Shift+Delete** simultaneously on the keyboard to open the appropriate window.

Remember to close the browser and restart it after clearing the cache and cookies.

Welcoming Task Update: RIC Vote

At the recommendation of the Welcoming Task Force, our Church Council has decided to pursue "Reconciling in Christ" (RIC) membership through the Reconciling Works organization. The RIC program recognizes Lutheran congregations that declare themselves as welcom-



ing to all people regardless of sexual orientation, racial identity, and any other self-identifier. Since its founding in 1974, RIC membership has grown to include approximately one thousand organizations across North America. Membership in this organization will benefit Holy Trinity in many ways. We will have access to training, education materials, and other resources, enabling us to continue building a more welcoming and inclusive Christian community. This will also facilitate connections with other Lutheran congregations across the country to learn and adopt some of their programming already in motion. We have already taken the first step by adopting a broad welcoming statement:

Holy Trinity Lutheran Church welcomes and affirms everyone seeking God's love and grace, regardless of faith background, age, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, ability, size, class, immigration or relationship status. We explicitly stand against hate and discrimination, as our Church community strives for racial equity and to continually grow and learn within the Body of Christ according to Christ's teachings. We are committed to creating and maintaining a welcoming and safe environment for all people.

Additional steps include our willingness to allow sanctuary/community space to be used for LGBTQIA+ weddings and blessings as well as a willingness to call an LGBT minister to our congregation. Note that we will still be in control of who we call. This is merely agreeing that we would not disqualify a candidate due to their orientation.

Lastly the organization asks that each RIC congregation provides a donation that is meaningful to them. We can set this amount based on our own congregational discretion. This could be added to our annual ministry spending plan or through annual requests from Extended Ministries.

What you do:

straw • Glue

- 1. Using the cup's circular shape, trace two identical circles on the paper. Carefully cut them out.
- 2. In pencil, draw a person's head on one circle. Then place the blank circle on top and use the image beneath to guide you in drawing a flame above the head.
- 3. Color the two images with markers.
- 4. Apply glue to the backs of the circles and sandwich the top of the straw between them so it looks like a lollipop. Let dry.
- 5. Roll the straw quickly between your hands to view a mini motion picture.




