Highlights--CONGREGATION COUNCIL MINUTES September 19, 2023

The Congregation Council Meeting was called to order at 7:04pm by President JoEllen Myers

Reports:

Treasurer's Report: Report for August was reviewed by Stephanie Gross. Property taxes for the rentals combined with below average giving resulted in a Net Loss for the month of \$-6,698. Year to date Net Loss increased to \$-10,954.

Financial Secretary's Report: The August report was included in the packet. Denny reiterated the lower giving pattern and also stated that in September the overall giving is at \$17,000 with another Sunday and additional electronic giving to be added to it.

Secretary's Report: Minutes from the August 22, 2023, Council meeting were presented.

Pastor's Report: Report for August 23rd -September 19th was emailed to members prior to meeting. Pastor noted that Sunday School for children has started, and the adult class led by Kurt Nielsen will start in October.

Ministry Teams:

Property Committee: Minutes from their meeting on September 12th were presented. Chip Haak reviewed stating that we have received the bill for engineering services from SitelogIQ for \$20,270 which was lower than the \$25,300 estimate. He also reported that the Executive Committee approved Property Committee recommendation to replace/repair some the lower level alley windows while Funk's is on site in order to realize cost savings instead of adding the costs to the operating Ministry Spending Plan (budget) at a later date. Also, to add a floor mat at the bottom of the alley steps.

Mutual Ministry: Met on Sept 6th and guests were Elizabeth Stuart and Anita Housman.

Unfinished Business:

Sanctuary Renewal Project: The recommendation from Property Committee is that the Task Force format, which was originally in place at the beginning of the Capital projects initiative, be established to facilitate this next phase. **No action to report.**

Council members for 2024: Ethan Ellenberger, Kendra Ruhl, and JoEllen Myers will serve a second three year term. We will need to recruit a replacement for Bob Sibert who will be completing six years. Thank you, Bob!

New Business:

Youth and Family Ministry Director candidate: JoEllen Myers, Pastor Brommer, Charis Mincavage, Nathan Paul, Danielle and Mark Mariano and Ruth Gardner met with candidate on Sept. 13th. Resume for Peter Fox provided to Council prior to meeting. JoEllen, Charis, and Mark reported from the interview that they were impressed with Peter's experience and ideas. Charis emphasized the importance of having a Director in place to continue and expand our current youth and family ministry especially since we have so many active and involved families. Charis addressed concerns about the salary but reiterated the importance of the position and that based on Peter's experience the \$20,000 per year was within the "market rate". Charis outlined that there are several different possibilities for funding the salary and that the Finance Committee would be consulted for input.

A motion was made by Rodney Gross, second by Charis Mincavage:

"The Executive Committee upon the unanimous recommendation of the interview committee recommend Peter Fox for approval to fill the position of Director of Youth and Family ministry at an annual salary of \$20,000 for the next three years. The recommendation includes requesting \$5000 from the annual allotment from the Endowment Fund to supplement the payment of salary for the remainder of 2023." Motion approved by Council (Jim Huebner recused himself because he is related to candidate)

Next Council Meeting: October 19th via Zoom @7pm Adjournment:

A *motion* to adjourn by Beth Dunham and second by Jim Huebner, approved by Council. The meeting concluded at 8:12pm with Lord's Prayer

STARTING A RIPPLE EFFECT

Shortly before his death, 80-year-old farmer Hody Childress asked his daughter to continue a practice he'd quietly conducted for years: taking a \$100 bill to a local pharmacist on the first of every month. For years, Childress anonymously came to the aid of neighbors in Geraldine, Alabama, who couldn't afford medications. "Don't tell a soul where the money came from," he instructed store owner Brooke Walker. "If they ask, just tell them it's a blessing from the Lord."

Thanks to the farmer's generosity, Walker could fill prescriptions for about 24 uninsured or underinsured people each year. "I was honored he allowed me to do that," she said, "and it really encouraged me to do the same in my life."

Childress wasn't wealthy but "always gave what he could," said daughter Tania Nix. "I think he felt like he couldn't not give," she added. "Giving that way, that just got on his heart." After word spread about Childress' generosity, other people were inspired to perform stealth outreach and a fund was established in his name.

A man in Oklahoma who shares Childress' surname said a story about the farmer caught his attention. They're probably not related, he wrote, but he'd feel proud if they were. "A man like that surely tried to follow the example of Jesus," the Oklahoman wrote, and "[his] story inspires me to be a better man."—adapted from *The Wired Word*

In Case of Weather Emergencies



Handicrafts can spark appreciation for simple items. Weave this basket as a gift.




What you need:

- Paper plate
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Yarn (different colors)

What you do:

- In the center of the plate, trace something round. Draw 9 lines (evenly spaced) from the circle to the plate's edge.
- Cut along each line, stopping at the center circle. Trim more of the plate off so the cuts make a gradual V shape.
- 3. Fold the plate's sides upward to form basket sides. Keep these upright as you weave a bowl-shaped basket.
- 4. Begin weaving a length of yarn at the circle's base. Hold the end of the yarn in place as you spread the length over and under each side of the plate.
- 5. Switch colors to make a pattern. Keep the yarn tight as you weave up the sides.
- 6. To finish, bend down any remaining paper. Leave a tail of yarn and tuck it under a woven portion. Share your craft with a friend!
