## From the Pastor's Desk...

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace.

John 1:1-4, 14, 16
The day of Epiphany falls on January 6, 2024. The word "Epiphany" means a movement in which you suddenly see or understand something in a new or very clear way. In the church, we celebrate January 6 in honor of the coming of the three kings to the infant Jesus Christ.

John writes about the Word (God) becoming one with us through the birth of Jesus. Through the birth of the Christ child, the light of God comes into our lives to guide us. A star filled the sky with light to guide the Wiseman to meet Jesus. Light is a central theme for our season of Epiphany that will take us through the days of January and the beginning of February. During this time the Northern Hemisphere experiences a gradual lightening of the darkest time of the year. This is an appropriate time for the church to reflect on Christ as our light and the light of God that can guide us in our daily lives.

There is an eastern European tradition where people are encouraged to take some time to pray for blessing on their homes on the day of Epiphany. A visual blessing may be inscribed with white chalk above the main door or written on a piece of paper to hang there: $20+\mathrm{C} \mathrm{M} \mathrm{B}+24$. The three letters stand for either the ancient Latin blessing "Christe mansionem benedicat" which means: "Christ, bless this house" or the legendary names of the magi (Caspar, Melchoir, and Balthasar).

## HIGHLIGHTS--Annual Business Meeting Minutes <br> November 19, 2023

Call to Order: at 11:14am by Council President JoEllen Myers.
Handouts: Agenda, Ministry Spending Plan -2024, Minutes from February 26, 2023, meeting.
Establishment of a Quorum: Established by Parliamentarian, Mark Mariano. Official attendance was 39.
Approval of Minutes:
February 26, 2023: JoEllen asked if there were any questions, comments, corrections. Hearing none she asked for a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Motion by Jim Huebner, second by Susan Bianchi. Motion approved.
Election of Council Members for 2024: JoEllen asked if there were any nominations from the floor, and hearing none presented the following slate of nominees:

Kendra Ruhl (second 3-year term)
Ethan Ellenberger (second 3-year term)
JoEllen Myers (second 3-year term)
Jen Keeler (first 3-year term)
Will Mariano-youth (1-year term)
A motion was made by Marilyn Layman, second by Brian Link to approve the nominees. Motion approved.
JoEllen recognized and thanked the current Council members for their service. Also, outgoing Council member, Bob Sibert, for six years of service.
Approval of Ministry Spending Plan - 2024
JoEllen asked for comments or questions. Hearing none, she asked for a motion to approve the Plan as presented. Motion made by Jim Huebner, second by MaryAnn Kilpatrick, and approved by Congregation.
Update/Status of Restroom renovations, HVAC replacement, Sanctuary Renewal
Chip Haak provided the following summary:
Phase 1--Main floor restroom renovations-work is complete. The ladies' restroom has been expanded to provide a new section which makes this ADA accessible. In both the restrooms, new flooring, partitions, walls, and fixtures.
Nursery-since the new restroom section took away part of the nursery area, the nursery has been moved to the library. The new nurseryhas been painted and an additional door added to give it two means of egress. We will be installing a TV in the nursery so occupants can watch the live stream of the worship service.
The library has moved across the hall.
Old Nursery-New Choir Room: The choir room and Alan Hair's office have been moved from the lower level of the church to the remaining area of the old nursery. Now a corner room with windows!
Phase 2--HVAC: Chip reminded the members that we have multiple HVAC systems throughout the church building and our goal is to eventually consolidate into one system powered by one source. The current project has two parts.

Replace Sanctuary A/C-now past it's expected life, the air handler and compressor are being replaced. The "old choir" room has been reconfigured to accommodate this new, larger equipment.
Prep work for the future system-new duct work, vents, electric has been installed in preparation for the consolidation to one system. Most of this was through the closets and walls in the Christian Education wing.
All this work will be completed by Christmas.
Additional benefits: We cleaned out unneeded "stuff" from the old nursery, and several of the closets. The according doors in the Fellowship Hall have been removed providing additional space. The remaining area in the "old choir" room has been renovated into a "storage area."
Financial: When the Congregation approved these two projects, we estimated that our current funding would be short by about $\$ 91,000$. The actual costs have tracked closely with the estimates and because of generous donations from the Congregation, our shortfall is now around $\$ 45,000$. This will be addressed as final invoices are received and Council and Finance will determine funding as approved by the Congregation in February.

Chip reminded members that they can give to Capital Repair Fund on our website.
Sanctuary Renewal: With Phases $1 \& 2$ complete, we will move forward with the Sanctuary renewal (Phase 3) which includes new flooring, painting, and lighting. Chip noted that the "sanctuary lighting is critical" as it is currently functioning thanks to some "creative wiring shortcuts."

We will be gathering revised estimates, developing a funding plan and hopefully return to the Congregation in the
Spring to move forward with the Sanctuary renewal.
JoEllen Myers thanked all those involved in getting these projects completed. (Property Committee, Finance, Staff)
Adjournment: Council President JoEllen Myers requested a motion to adjourn which was provided by Brian Link, second by Mark Mariano. Motion approved.
Closing Prayer: Meeting concluded at 11:34am with Pastor Brommer leading the Congregation in the Lord's Prayer.

1)Vwawa Congregation is our companion congregation in the Konde Diocese in Tanzania. This offering allows us to help a vital and growing congregation in Tanzania. Vwawa is better off than most Konde congregations, but it is still very rustic. There is no running water and the bathrooms are just holes in the ground. They have many, many orphans due to the high mortality rate of AIDS. The money that we send is used for education, support of orphans, and support of their evangelists.
2)The Capital Repair Fund supports projects to renovate and maintain our property.
3)Love in the Name of Christ of Greater Hershey The mission of Love INC of Greater Hershey is to mobilize the church to transform lives and the community in the name of Christ. The primary ways Love INC does this are through the centralized call center or Clearinghouse, and their three large ministries: The Bicycle Ministry, which provides bicycles to children and adults; a Personal Care Closet, which provides personal, household, and baby basics not covered by food stamps; and The Parsonage Ministries, which is a free, home away from home for families of patients at the Hershey Medical Center.

## What you need:

- Clean cardboard egg carton

- Scissors (and adult help)
- Epsom salt
- Plastic zippered bags (one per color of dye)
- Food coloring
- Glue
- Paintbrush



## What you do:

1. Cut out the tops and bottoms of all the egg compartments so you can make 6 ball shapes.
2. In each bag, put 3 tablespoons of Epsom salt and a drop or two of food coloring. Seal and shake to mix.
3. With the paintbrush, spread glue inside two egg-carton halves. Sprinkle a spoonful of Epsom salt into those halves. Then close and shake.
4. Open your homemade geode and shake out excess salt.
5. Optional: Preserve the crystals with a coat of clear-drying glue.
