Annual Meeting | Feb. 25

through the 40 days of Lent.

The word Lent literally means "Lengthening" (of daylight hours). It is derived from the Latin word that means Spring. Lent is a time when we are encouraged to consider how we fast, pray and share. Fasting means to give up those things that keep us from focusing on God's active presence in our lives and could include taking on a discipline to strengthen your walk with God.

Prayer is how we communicate with God and Lent can challenge us to consider how we spend time listening and talking to God. Sharing includes offering our gifts of time, talent and wealth in thanksgiving to God and Lent provides a call to evaluate our generosity.

As we gather for Worship on Ash Wednesday, we will be given the opportunity to have a cross of ash traced on our foreheads. The ashes are made by burning palm branches from Palm Sunday of the previous year. The palm ashes are mixed with some oil and used to trace the cross as we hear the words quoted from Genesis: "Remember you are Dust and to Dust you shall return." This is an ancient tradition of our faith. In Jewish and Christian history, ashes are a

sign of mortality and repentance. Mortality, because when we die, our bodies eventually decompose, and we become dust/dirt/ash. Repentance, because historically, when people felt remorse for something they did, they would put ashes on their head and wear sackcloth (scratchy clothing) to remind them that sin is uncomfortable.

Lent is a time of reflection about our journey of faith as we live our daily lives. The familiar words about love found in the 13 th chapter of 1st Corinthians were written by the apostle Paul to the people of Corinth because they were having trouble getting along. They were struggling to live and work together in harmony and peace. There were divisions and arguments happening so Paul offers advice on how to live together, especially in stressful times. Paul believes that love needs to be the foundation of everything we do. You can be successful in your business life and have all the money in the world, but if you do not have love, you really have nothing. And in the end, you can lose all the stuff and money of life, but true love will not fail. In reality, love is a choice we make.

The Corinthians text describes what a lasting and genuine love looks like. Paul says that you will need patience in your loving. A lasting love will not include envy, boasting, and being too proud to admit that we have been wrong. Certainly loving as Paul describes is important in any romantic kind of love. But this love that Paul describes is not limited to a romantic kind of love. To love as Paul describes is really essential in all the ways we strive to love as Christians, loving as we are loved by our God whose love is unconditional and never ending for us.



if necessary but will miss your presence with us. Above all, be safe and use your good judgment to decide if you can get to church or not.





- 1. Cut yarn into 12-inch pieces.
- 2. Place cookie cutters atop a baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
- 3. Combine cornstarch and water in a saucepan. Heat mixture over medium heat, stirring until thick and smooth. Remove from heat and cool to form a "glue."
- 4. Dip each piece of yarn into the mixture to coat completely. Squeeze off any excess.
- Place yarn in the cookie cutters, allowing pieces to cross and loop within the heart. Add more until the cookie cutter is filled and the yarn looks like a heart.
- Remove cookie cutters and bake the sheet for two hours at 150°F, or until hearts are dry and hard.
