The Congregation Council Meeting was called to order at 7:03pm by President JoEllen Myers

I.Reports:

- a. Treasurer's Report: Report for December was reviewed by Stephanie Gross. There were five Sundays in December (and Christmas) which resulted in giving for the month of \$44,338 Net Income for December was \$12,281. We finished the year with Net Income of \$3,379 which will be transferred to the Capital Repair Fund.
 - i. **Special Accounts Report:** Included in the Council packet; Stephanie has no additional comments.
 - ii. **Youth Investment Fund Report:** The account had a gain of \$6,148 which recaptured the 2022 loss of \$2,974. The ending balance for 2023 is \$39,330.
 - iii. ELCA Mission Investment account; The ending balance is \$33,623.
- b. Financial Secretary's Report: The December report was included in the packet.
- **c. Secretary's Report:** Minutes from the December 14, 2023, Council meeting was presented.
- d. Pastor's Report: Report for December 15, 2023- January 16, 2024, was emailed to members prior to meeting.



Church services will be held if at all possible even when winter weather causes concern. Please know that we understand that our many volunteers may not be able to make it to church on those days. We will fill in for you


if necessary but will miss your presence with us. Above all, be safe and use your good judgment to decide if you can get to church or not.

Use scrap paper to fuel new growth and make a gift that keeps on giving.

What you need:

- Scrap paper
- Water
- Herb or flower seeds
- Blender
- Strainer
- Cookie sheet
- Towel
- Adult help



What you do:

- 1. Tear the scrap paper into strips and place in a bowl. Cover the paper with water and let it soak overnight.
- 2. Pour the mixture into a blender and blend about 10 seconds.
- 3. Strain and squeeze the paper pulp to remove excess water. Place in a bowl.
- 4. Sprinkle seeds over the pulp and mix to incorporate them into the pulp.
- Shape the pulp into a flat layer on the cookie sheet. Use a towel to soak up excess water. Allow the paper to dry completely.
- 6. Tear paper into shapes or fold into a card. You can plant the paper directly into soil. Water it and then watch your plants grow!
