The Council meeting was held via Zoom. Reports and other documents were emailed to Council members prior to the meeting.

The Congregation Council Meeting was called to order at 7:02pm by President JoEllen Myers

I.Reports:

- **a.** Treasurer's Report: Report for July was reviewed by Stephanie Gross. For the month, the Net Income was \$1,243. Year to date we have a Net Loss: \$(-17,875). In August, the rental property taxes are due so that will be a large expense, and so far the giving has been below average.
- b. Financial Secretary's Report: The July report was included in the packet.
- c. Secretary's Report: Minutes from July 8, 2024, Council meeting were presented.
- d. Pastor's Report: Report for July 9-August 20 was emailed to members prior to meeting.
- e. Correspondence: Thank you letters for financial support
 - i. Hershey Food Bank: \$300
 - ii.Lutheran Camping Corporation: \$310
- f. Ministry Teams:
 - i. Property Committee minutes-July 9 and August 13 included in packet.
 - 1. Chip Haak provided update on HVAC: Heim finishing some minor work, then, along with mechanical engineer will address reducing the noise level of the outside unit.
- **II.** Unfinished Business:
- a. Vacation Bible School: Successful event with 12 children participating.
- **III.** New Business:
- **a. Mission Investment Fund:** We have a CD coming due on 09/12/2024. Handout of the current MIF rates was provided and reviewed.
 - *A motion* by Mark Mariano, second by Jim Huebner to renew the MIF CD for a 7-month period at a rate of 4.96% was approved by Council.
- **b.** Congregation meeting on August 25: Approval of repairs to 216 rental property. Chip Haak reviewed the list of estimates, the largest being the HVAC replacement and refinishing of the wood floors. Much of the painting will be done by HTL members. After discussion of the estimated total cost the following motion was made by Charis Mincavage, second by Mark Mariano
 - i. Motion: To withdraw money from the Unrestricted Endowment Fund to pay for the necessary upgrades to equipment, electrical and plumbing repairs, replacement of fixtures, painting and general repairs for 216 Cocoa Avenue rental property not to exceed a cost of \$65,000. Motion approved by Council.
- c. God's Work, Our Hands-September 8: goal is to assemble 200 school kits.
- d. New Office Hours: After trial period, permanently changing hours going forward to 9am-3pm Monday-Thursday.
- e. Ministry Spending Plan/Budget 2025: Process is underway.
- IV. Next Council Meeting: September 10, 2024, via Zoom at 7:00pm [DATE CHANGE]
- V. Adjournment: A *motion* to adjourn by Mark Mariano and second by Beth Dunham, approved by Council. The meeting concluded at 8:10pm with Lord's Prayer

Special Congregational Meeting - August 25, 2024 11:00 AM - Meeting Minutes

- I. Call to Order
 - a. Establishment of a quorum: A quorum was established by Parliamentarian, Mark Mariano, and the meeting was called to order at 11:02am by Council President JoEllen Myers. Official attendance was 42.
- II. Opening Prayer: Pastor Brommer
- III. New Business: Repairs to 216 Cocoa Ave rental property.
 - a. The Council recommended motion was read by President JoEllen Myers. It was also part of the agenda handout.
 - b. On behalf of the Property Committee, Chip Haak provided some background information about the rental properties, benefits of doing the repairs, and estimates of those repairs.
 - i. The market values since we purchased them in 2009 have risen about \$150,000-\$200,000 for **each** property.
 - ii. The Net Income from the properties contributes about \$13,000 annually to our operating budget.
 - iii. Current rent of \$1,200/month for 216 Cocoa is way below the market rate. With these repairs and upgrades we can expect the rent to be between \$1,850-\$2,000/month.
 - iv. The list of individual repairs and upgrades were listed with the largest being the installation of a heat pump system at a cost of \$27,960. Also, the refinishing of the wood floors at \$8,500. The total estimated cost is \$65,000.
 - c. Recommended source for cost of repairs is Unrestricted Endowment Fund
 - i. Value of Endowment has grown in 10 years from \$600,055 to \$835,323
 - 1. During that time, we have withdrawn \$172,000 as part of our Extended Ministries program to support various charities like Lutheran Disaster Relief, Food Banks, Love INC, Lutheran Camping Corporation, World Hunger, etc.
 - ii. Chip made the following point: By withdrawing funds from the Endowment, we are essentially moving money from one investment to another which will significantly increase the rental income from the property as well as the market value.
 - d. Ouestions:
 - i. Are we confident that the \$65,000 will cover the Total Estimated Cost?
 - 1. Chip explained that the larger cost items like the HVAC and floor refinishing are estimates from the contractor. The bath and kitchen repairs are our best approximations. We did include a "misc./contingency amount of \$5,900. We are confident in the \$65,000 amount.
 - ii. Are we going to pay back the Endowment Fund for this withdrawal?
 - 1. Chip stated that it is not part of the motion. However, at the end of each year if we have a positive Net Income in the operating budget, the Council decides what will happen to that. This could be given to charities, Capital Repair Fund, or retained. Giving some to the Endowment could be considered.
 - e. Vote: Dennis Schwenk to moved to accept the motion, second by Jordan Paul.
 - i. To withdraw money from the Unrestricted Endowment Fund to pay for the necessary upgrades to equipment, electrical and plumbing repairs, replacement of fixtures, painting, and general repairs for 216 Cocoa Avenue rental property not to exceed a cost of \$65,000. Unanimously approved by Congregation
- IV. Adjournment: Motion by Kirk Sponaugle, second by Adam Gardner to adjourn. Congregation approved.
- V. Closing Prayer: Pastor Brommer thanked the Property Committee and Council members for their work and leader-ship with this initiative. Pastor Brommer led the Congregation in reciting the Lord's Prayer.

The Connection Center has met 1,727 needs so far in 2024. This is up 11% from the same time last year.




The Personal Care Closet has delivered 12,679 personal hygiene, household care, and baby items to participants certified with one of 3 local food banks. This is up over 40% from 2023!






