HIGHLIGHTS--CONGREGATION COUNCIL MINUTES September 10, 2024

The Congregation Council Meeting was called to order at 7:02pm by Vice President Charis Mincavage

I. Reports:

- **a.** Treasurer's Report: Report for August was reviewed by Stephanie Gross. For the month, the Net Loss was \$-9.803. In August we paid the rental property taxes of \$4,758 which impacted the bottom line. Giving was OK. Year to date we have a Net Loss: \$(-27,655).
 - i. The escrow money, \$1,575, from former 216 tenants has been moved to the Capital Repair Fund.
- b. Financial Secretary's Report: The August report was included in the packet.
- c. Secretary's Report: Minutes from August 20, 2024, Council meeting were presented.
 - i. Minutes from Special Congregation Meeting on August 25, 2024, were presented.
- d. Pastor's Report: Report August 21 to September 10th was emailed to members prior to meeting.
 - i. Pastor will be on vacation from 09/23-09/29. Pastor Hummer to supply.
 - ii. At the June 2025 assembly we will be electing a new Bishop. In preparation we will have to identify our delegates by December so they can attend some pre-assembly orientations. <u>Agenda</u> item for next month.
- e. Correspondence: Thank you letters for financial support
 - i. Bowman Trust (Hershey beautification): \$250
 - ii. Lutheran World Relief: \$200
- f. Ministry Teams:
 - i. Worship: Choir will begin practice this Sunday.
 - 1. Recent problems with sound system are being addressed with A/V Solutions.
 - ii. Youth & Family Formation: Sunday Schools and Youth group begins this Sunday.
 - 1. Middle school age youth attending Synod event "Alive" on Sept. 27-29
 - iii. Property Committee
 - 1. Chip Haak provided update on HVAC: Met on 09/06 with mechanical engineer, A/C installer, and general contractor to discuss the noise problem. They are working on a solution and will report back on Sept. 19th.
 - 2. Repairs on 216: In progress, HVAC replacement starting within the next week.

II. Unfinished Business:

a. God's Work, Our Hands-September 8: We assembled 182 kits and purchasing some more supplies we can complete 24 more.

III. New Business:

- **a.** Risk and Vulnerability Assessment: Chip Haak arranged to have the PA. State Police do a walk around of our exterior and interior areas to assess our safety in the event of an intruder incident.
 - i. Chip, Jim Huebner, and Karen Kline participated in the walk around. The State Police will provide a written report with recommendations in about a month.
- **b.** New Member Follow-up: We have had several visitors over the past few months and Pastor Brommer asked for the Council's ideas as to how we can do additional follow-up with the visitors who potentially might become members. This would be in addition to the written acknowledgements that the Pastor does now. Development of a procedure will be discussed at next meeting.
- IV. Next Council Meeting: October 15, 2024, via Zoom at 7:00pm
- V. Adjournment: A *motion* to adjourn by Mark Mariano and second by Beth Dunham, approved by Council. The meeting concluded at 8:07pm with Lord's Prayer

From the Pastor's Desk



Thanksgiving is a theme of November for us as we gather for worship and as we gather with family and friends. On November 3, we celebrate All Saints Sunday as we worship and remember the lives of those who have died since last November. On November 24, we will gather to give thanks for our shared ministry at Holy Trinity as we meet for our annual congregation meeting. On November 28, we have the opportunity to give thanks for the bounty of blessings

we are giving as we celebrate the Thanksgiving holiday with family and friends.

When I reflect on November, my memories turn to worship experiences I had long ago as the churches of Middletown gathered together to give thanks. Each year, we came together at Seven Sorrows Catholic Church to share a combined liturgy. The church was filled with members from the different denominations of the town. The choirs of individual congregations joined together to lead us. One of the most vivid memories I have of those worship services is the singing of the hymn, *For the Beauty of the Earth*. The words were written by Folliott Sandford Pierpoint in the spring of 1863 as he sat on a hilltop outside his native city of Bath, England, admiring the country view and the winding Avon River. The view inspired him to write a poem that became this beloved hymn as he considered God's gifts in creation and in the church.

The verses of the hymn describe some of the simple things of life to remember in our prayers of thanksgiving like the beauty of the earth, the love of family and friends, the church, and Christ, God's best gift of all.

Please consider joining our church family as we worship in the month of November as we give thanks to God for our many blessings.

The scholarship is used to support schools and the Lutheran Seminary in Konde Diocese.

CAPITAL REPAIR FUND




