HIGHLIGHTS--CONGREGATION COUNCIL MINUTES October 15, 2024

The Congregation Council Meeting was called to order at 7:00pm by President JoEllen Myers

I.Reports:

- Treasurer's Report: Report for September was reviewed by Stephanie Gross. For the month, the Net Loss was (\$-9,292). Contributing factors were a quarterly bill for flowers, \$1,170, including those for Easter. Property Insurance charges \$2,530. On the Income side, the giving was OK, but we have a loss of rental income of \$1,200. In the operating account, year to date we have a Net Loss: (\$-36,947).
 - i. Executive Committee will prepare a letter to members thanking them for their financial support of our ongoing ministries and the Capital Repairs Fund, and request that they consider an increase to their current giving amount.
 - ii.Summary of ELCA Mission Investment Funds was included in packet: \$ 34,263.
 - iii. Quarterly reports for Special Accounts, Youth Investment Account and Escrow Account were included in the packet.
- b. Financial Secretary's Report: The September report was included in the packet.
- Secretary's Report: Minutes from September 10, 2024, Council meeting were presented.
- Pastor's Report: Report September 11th to October 15th, was emailed to members prior to meeting.
 - i. Pastor will be at Nawakwa Quilt Retreat 11/06-11/11. Pastor Hummer to supply.
- Correspondence: Thank you letters for financial support
 - i. United Lutheran Seminary:\$ 235
- **Ministry Teams:**
 - i. Worship: Altar Guild Minutes-09/22 included in packet
 - ii. Witness: Faith In Action will do Adopt a Highway on October 26th; also planning Food Bank drive for Advent season.
 - iii. Share:
 - 1. **Property Committee:** Minutes from 09/10 & 10/08 included in packet.
 - Jim Huebner stated that the renovations and upgrades are almost complete and the 216 property should be available for rent at the beginning of November.
 - 2. Extended Ministries: A recommendation to use \$3,000 from this year's Endowment Allocation to be sent to Lutheran Disaster Relief for Hurricane Assistance was sent to Extended Ministries Committee on 10/04. Their approval was emailed to Council members and was approved by them on 10/07.
 - a. The contributions which have been made by members will be added to this.
- II. **Unfinished Business:**
 - Ministry Spending Plan-2025: Draft has been circulated to Finance and Executive Committee for review and comments.
 - i. Special Council Meeting to approve the plan will be held on October 29, 2024, at 7:00pm via Zoom
 - ii. Congregation Meeting will be held November 24, 2024, at 11:00am for discussion and approval.
 - b. Risk and Vulnerability Assessment: Chip Haak stated that the report from the State Police was received recently, and he will review the recommendations.
 - Visitor Follow-up: Procedure is in progress. Pastor Brommer also noted that we have several new individuals and families interested in joining.
 - d. Synod Delegates for 2025 Assembly: JoEllen Myers and Rodney Gross are willing to serve. A motion to approve them as delegates was made by Jim Huebner, second by Jen Keeler. Approved by Council.
- III. Next Council Meeting: November 19, 2024, via Zoom at 7:00pm December Council Meeting will have to be rescheduled due to Council members' conflicts with school events.
- IV. Adjournment: A motion to adjourn by Beth Dunham and second by Jen Keeler, approved by Council. The meeting concluded at 7:58pm with Lord's Prayer



December Special Offering Envelopes



The purpose of the Hershey Food Bank and Community Outreach is to serve the Derry Township community by providing food and assistance with the temporary needs of families and individuals in financial distress. The Food Bank distributes food twice monthly and also prepares food baskets at Thanksgiving and Christmas to families identified and referred from churches, schools and others as being in need. In addition, general gift cards and gift certificates for children's clothing are included with the Christmas food baskets. For established clients they may also provide financial assistance for utility bills and rent payments on an emergency basis. Most cases are referred to Social Service agencies for further assistance. Budget counseling is available and provided free of charge.

Besides the monetary donations, the Food Bank relies upon donations of non-perishable food items such as canned vegetables fruits, soups, etc. as well as paper goods. Food donations can be dropped off in the narthex at Holy Trinity or taken to the drop off bins at the Food Bank, 120 E. Derry Road, Hershev.

People of Holy Trinity,

Thank you for your recent gift for our neighbors in the south rebuilding after the hurricanes came through last month. The devastation that our LWR team sees on the ground is heartbreaking. It is going to take months — if not years — for our neighbors to rebuild in North Carolina and throughout the Southeast.

Our LWR team spent a day a few weeks ago at a local hotel hosting 168 homeless veterans. Prior to Hurricane Helene, these men were living in transitional housing and rebuilding their lives. When Hurricane Helene ripped through Asheville, these veterans lost nearly all their possessions and the stability they were working so hard to rebuild. Earlier this week, a local hotel was secured to become their new home for the next 6+ months. Thanks to the love of Lutherans, each of the men received an LWR Quilt and Personal Care Kit. To say these men were grateful would be an understatement. In fact, one man returned after putting the new quilt on his bed and said, "Ma'am, I put that new quilt on my bed and the room just shone with

those beautiful colors. Thank you for all the love in that quilt."




