





Our mission is to Worship, Grow, Witness and Share through Christ's love in Service to God and Neighbor.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace.—John 1:1-4, 14, 16

In the church, we remember the visit of the Magi, or the Three Kings, to Jesus after he was born on the festival day of Epiphany. The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek word meaning "to reveal". The word "Epiphany" also means a movement in which you suddenly see or understand something in a new or very clear way. The date of Epiphany is January 6 but this year we will celebrate Epiphany on Sunday, January 5th to begin our liturgical season of Epiphany that will continue through Sunday, February 23.

John writes about the Word (God) becoming one with us through the birth of Jesus. Through the birth of the Christ child, the light of God comes into our lives to guide us. A star filled the sky with light to guide the Wiseman to meet Jesus. Light is a central theme for our season of Epiphany that will take us through the days of January and the beginning of February. During this time the Northern Hemisphere experiences a gradual lightening of the darkest time of the year. This is an appropriate time for the church to reflect on Christ as our light and the light of God that can guide us in our daily lives.

There is an eastern European tradition where people are encouraged to take some time to pray for blessing on their homes on the day of Epiphany. A visual blessing may be inscribed with white chalk above the main door or written on a piece of paper to hang there:

20 + C M B + 25. The three letters stand for either the ancient Latin blessing "Christe mansionem benedicat" which means: "Christ, bless this house" or the legendary names of the magi (Caspar, Melchoir, and Balthasar).

HIGHLIGHTS--CONGREGATION COUNCIL MINUTES November 19, 2024

Reports:

Treasurer's Report: Report for October was reviewed by Stephanie Gross. Giving for the month was above average and resulted in Net Income of \$3,277. This may have been in response to the letter sent to members regarding our deficit situation. In the operating account, year to date we have a Net Loss: (\$-33,670).

Financial Secretary's Report: The October report was included in the packet. <u>Denny noted that giving for November is at \$28,660 plus online giving of \$4,500 which in total is one of the better giving amounts this year. Also, we still have one more Sunday in November.</u>

Secretary's Report: Minutes from October 10th and October 29th meetings were in the Council packet.

Pastor's Report: Report for period October 16th – November 19th was emailed to members prior to meeting.

Correspondence: Thank you letters for financial support

Finance: We have a Mission Investment Fund CD coming due on 12/4/2024. Chip Haak reviewed the current rate offerings, and the terms of the CDs we currently hold.

A motion was made by Jim Huebner, second by Mark Mariano to reinvest the CD for a 2-year period at 4.0%. Motion passed.

Property Committee: Minutes from 11/13 meeting included in packet.

Jim Huebner stated that the 216 Cocoa renovations and upgrades are complete. The property is being advertised for rent. One suggestion from realtor was that we reconsider our "no (more) pets" condition. After discussion, the Council decided that we would allow pets under 35lbs and evaluate the pet prior to agreeing to rental contract.

Extended Ministries: At December Council meeting, review remaining amount of Endowment allocation for further distribution of funds

Pastor Brommer retirement: The Pastor informed the Council that after much deliberation she will be retiring at the end of February 2025. While a difficult decision because of her love for the members and staff of the congregation, she feels it is time for her to transition into a new chapter in her life.

Pastor Cindy briefly explained the next steps in the process as to working with the Synod to first find an interim Pastor and then to go through the call process.

Approval of Ministry Spending Plan - 2025

JoEllen asked for comments or questions.

Chip Haak provided the following highlights on the Plan:

Thanked the members for their response to our letter regarding the current operating account deficit. October giving was above average, and we ended with a Net Income which reduced the deficit by approximately \$3,000. Also, November is trending to be the highest month of giving this year.

On the 2025 Plan, row 21 "Unrestricted Endowment Fund Contribution" is new. This allows us to take \$10,000 from the Endowment Fund to supplement giving and assist with cash flow issues should we run into another deficit situation.

Rental Income (row 22) is projected to increase by approximately \$10,000 due to the renovations at the 216 Cocoa rental property.

Synod Faith Commitment (row182) has been reduced to reflect the decrease in our member giving. Chip noted that this is a "pledge," and we can contribute more at yearend if our financial situation allows.

Ministry Spending Plan Shortfall Contingency (row 202). This is a new section which allows the Council to withdraw **up to** \$15,000 from the Unrestricted Endowment Fund should we encounter a "cash flow" problem.

Chip clarified questions on the procedure for withdrawing funds from the Endowment Fund.

Hearing no further questions or comments, JoEllen Myers asked for a motion to approve the Plan as presented. **Motion** made by Jim Huebner, second by Mark Mariano, and **approved by Congregation**.

Unfinished Business: None

New Business: Pastor Brommer: It is with a mix of emotions, filled with both gratitude and a sense of peace, that I share the news that I plan to retire as your Pastor, effective March 1, 2025. After 22 years of serving alongside you, John and I believe it is time to transition into a new chapter of our lives. A letter to all congregation members will be sent shortly. Information about the hiring of an interim Pastor and the process of calling a new Pastor will be shared as it becomes available. I am deeply thankful for the privilege of serving as your Pastor, sharing in your joys, and sorrow. I am confident that Holy Trinity has a bright future as you continue to turn to God for guidance.

Adjournment: Council President JoEllen Myers requested **a motion** to adjourn which was provided by Dennis Schwenk, second by Mark Mariano. **Motion approved**.

Closing Prayer: Meeting concluded at 11:38am with JoEllen leading the Congregation in the Lord's Prayer.

The primary ways Love INC does this are through the centralized call center or Clearinghouse, and their three large ministries: The Bicycle Ministry, which provides bicycles to children and adults; a Personal Care Closet, which provides personal, household, and baby basics not covered by food stamps; and The Parsonage Ministries, which is a free, home away from home for families of patients at the Hershey Medical Center.




FAITH IN ACTION PROJECT FOR FEBRUARY
