

The Council meeting was held via Zoom. Reports and other documents were emailed to Council members prior to the meeting. The Congregation Council Meeting was called to order at 7:01pm by President JoEllen Myers

Reports:

Treasurer's Report: Report for November was reviewed by Stephanie Gross. Giving for the month was above average and resulted in Net Income of \$19,197. This may have been in response to the letter sent to members regarding our deficit situation. It includes the application of the \$5,000 which was being held in reserve related to Youth Director salary. In the operating account, year to date we have a Net Loss: (\$-14,473). This is trending in line with the Ministry Spending Plan projection for 2024.

Financial Secretary's Report: The November report was included in the packet. <u>Denny noted that December is a five Sunday month and includes Christmas.</u>

Secretary's Report: Minutes from November 19th Council Meeting and November 24th Congregation Business meeting were in the Council packet.

Pastor's Report: Report for period November 20th-December 19th was emailed to members prior to meeting. Pastor noted the transfer of Jeffrey and Diane Ellenberger to a congregation in Lancaster.

Jim Huebner stated that there has not been much activity as far as renting the 216 Cocoa property, as this is not the time of year when people typically relocate.

Unfinished Business:

Risk and Vulnerability Report-Non-functioning outdoor lights have been repaired.

Pastor Retirement: Pastor is in contact with Synod and anticipates more of their involvement as we enter new year.

New Business:

Cookie Walk: How the proceeds of \$817 from the Cookie Walk should be used was referred to Council for action. After discussion of several different options:

Apply \$400 to the Hospitality line in the Operating Account to cover the advertising costs for Walk and the cost of paper supplies etc. used for youth and member events. (Chip Haak explained that this line was not properly funded in the Ministry Spending plan).

Apply \$417 to the Youth Investment Fund in the Special Accounts.

A motion to approve the two options was made by Mark Mariano, second by Rodney Gross, motion carried.



Family Retreat Camp Kirchenwald (Near Mt. Gretna) Greetings to everyone out there! 2025 is off to a great start and things are already heating up. Not outside, it's freezing out there; but inside the calendar of events is starting to fill up. Things have been awesome so far this season and January was no exception. Before I move on and tell you more about what we did, I would like to take a quick opportunity to invite everyone to come out to the next HTY or Family Fellowship event. February is a "new" start, so to speak, that means it's the perfect time to take a chance and come out and check out what these events are all about. HTY is our Youth Group here at Holy Trinity and it's for everyone in grades 6-12. HTY is open to everyone and friends are always invited and encouraged in all that we do. HTY normally meets on the first Sunday of each month from 5-7:30PM, and sometimes later on in the month, depending. At HTY it's all faith, fun, and fellowship. We will play lots of wacky youth group games, do group building exercises, have large and small group activities, share a meal together, and close down each HTY Night in prayer together. There are also a handful of HTY events each season which might occur on a different day or at different time.

Likewise, the time is always right to get out to our Family Fellowship events. Family Fellowship normally occurs on the third Sunday of each month, after church and in the afternoon time, depending on the event. Most months, we have a luncheon that starts right after church. This is an opportunity to share a meal, have conversation, play a game, and enjoy time together. Family Fellowship luncheons are not only for our Holy Trinity families, but rather we invite the whole congregation to come out and take part in them too. Family Fellowship luncheons and events are a great way to get to know your fellow church brothers and sisters. As you can see with HTY and Family Fellowship, the calendar is quite full, but like I said above, the time to get involved is now. Hope to see you at both soon.


Kid's Corner



What you do:

- 1. Draw a flower shape on paper and cut it out.
- 2. Place the flower template on felt and draw around it with the marker.
- 3. Cut out the felt flower. Then cut a small slit or hole through it.
