The Congregation Council Meeting was called to order at 7:02pm by President Rodney Gross

I.Reports:

a. Treasurer's Report: Report for December was reviewed by Stephanie Gross. Giving for the month was excellent and resulted in Net Income of \$18,616. In the operating account, year to date we have a Net Income: \$4,208. Stephanie noted that our expenses for the year came in within \$200 of what was projected in the Ministry Spending Plan.

- f. Ministry Teams:
 - i. Witness: Faith In Action
 - 1. Rodney Gross, Steve Shuey, and Bob Homisak delivered the items collected during our Advent season to the Hershey Food Bank totaling 290lbs.
 - 2. Last night ten members of Congregation prepared food for and served 20-25 unhoused individuals in Harrisburg. Extremely cold temperatures reduced the number being served as some chose warm shelter rather than food!

 - a. Jim Huebner stated that, except for vendor training on thermostat programming, all aspects of the HVAC project have been completed.
 - b. 216 Cocoa Ave property has been rented at \$2,000 per month.
 - c. Currently experiencing problems with boiler and related pipes which are being addressed. Chip Haak noted that this is not related to the new HVAC system.
- iii. Extended Ministries: Committee has recommended the following for the Council's approval:

 - iii. Christ Lutheran Church -Health Ministries-\$1,000

This will be in support of the "tiny houses" village (Veterans Grove) in Harrisburg. A brick "thanking veterans for their service" from Holy Trinity will be placed in walkway around the village. A motion to approve was made by JoEllen Myers, second by Deb Brooks. Approved by Council.

The first document which has been executed by the Council President, Vice President and Pastor Brommer is the "Policy for a Covenant of Closure for Former Ministers and their Calling Communities". This covenant helps to clarify the new relationship between the former minister, congregation, and the people they formerly served. It details what the members of the Congregation "will or will not do, and what the former Pastor "will or will not do". The covenant allows members to fully accept the authority and guidance of succeeding minister, both interim and called, even as they cherish the memory and leadership of the former minister.

Faith in Action: Civic Advocacy

Deitrich Bonhoeffer said, "Faith without works is not faith at all, but a simple lack of obedience to God." Cheap Grace is what he called accepting grace without true discipleship.

Many are suffering in our world today. You, like me, may be wondering how you can affect meaningful change in the world within the context of our Lutheran faith.

<u>Lutheran Advocacy Ministry in Pennsylvania</u> (LAMPa) is a state public policy office of the ELCA. It provides congregations, synods and Lutheran Institutions in PA with resources, training and information about the work of being a public church. If you want to do something to make a positive difference in today's world, this is a great place to start.

First, <u>sign up</u> for their e-news and action alerts. You won't receive a deluge of emails, but you will hear about LAMPa events and get a monthly e-newsletter with information about legislative policies that pertain to our civic life as it intersects with our faith.

Next, <u>register</u> for *Hope in a Divided World:* A Faithful Response to Christian Nationalism. This event is March 7-8 at the United Lutheran Seminary in Gettysburg. Dr. Lori Brandt Hale, president of the International Bonhoeffer Society – English Language Section, and Amanda Tyler of Christians Against Christian Nationalism will discuss how people of faith can authentically and humbly act at the intersection of civic life and faith, in contrast and response to the forces of Christian nationalism, using the legacy and theology of Dietrich Bonhoeffer as a guide. If you can't attend in person (like me), you can register for the livestream.

Finally, consider attending <u>Lutheran Day in the Capitol</u> on May 13, 2025. This is an opportunity to meet with your state legislators and advocate for <u>policies</u> that address hunger, promote household financial stability, and expand and safeguard access to quality, affordable healthcare, among other issues. I hope to organize a group from HTLC to attend. I know, for many the thought of meeting with legislators is about as appealing as slathering yourself with honey and swinging a bat at a beehive but trust me this is painless. In my experience, our elected state officials want to hear from their constituents.

Let me stress that I am **NOT** promoting any partisan political view. I believe that people of faith need to take a stand and advocate for our Christian values.

This snack's layers mimic properties of our planet's crust.




- 1 cup rolled oats
- ½ cup nut butter (divided)
- ½ cup chocolate chips
- Microwave-safe bowl
- Silicone mini baking cups

What you do:

- Combine the oats and ½ cup of the nut butter. Mix until oats stick together.
- 2. Place 2 teaspoons of oat mixture in each baking cup. Press with a spoon. Freeze for 10 minutes.
- 3. Spread remaining nut butter atop the cups. Freeze for 10 more minutes.
- 4. Microwave the chocolate chips 30 seconds. Stir and keep heating for 30-second intervals until melted.
- 5. Spread melted chocolate atop the cups. Freeze until chocolate is firm.
- Remove from the molds and enjoy! Refrigerate leftovers in an airtight container.
