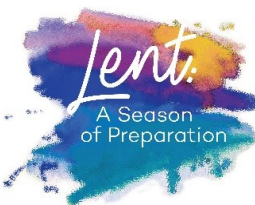

The Congregation Council Meeting was called to order at 7:00pm by President Rodney Gross

Rodney introduced and welcomed Pastor Janice Mills who will be serving as our "bridge" Pastor for March and April. She will be working 20hrs per week with her focus on worship and visitation.

Reports:

Treasurer's Report: Report for January was reviewed by Stephanie Gross. Giving for the month was good, however we had several large bills for church repairs and flowers, plus no rental income for 216. This resulted in a Net Loss for the month of \$-3,975.51.

Financial Secretary's Report: The January report was included in the packet. Denny added that so far in February, giving has been good.

Secretary's Report: Minutes from January 21st Council Meeting were included in the Council packet.

Pastor's Report: Report for period January 22nd to February 18th was emailed to members prior to meeting.

Pastoral Transition Update: The Synod believes they will have a potential candidate to serve as "interim" Pastor beginning in May.

The Policy of Covenant of Closure has been signed by Pastor Brommer, Council President and Vice President.

A copy will be made available to members.

Audit Committee Report-Audit completed on February 1st and report included in Council packet.

No issues were identified.

Recruiting Ushers: Rodney Gross reported that several members have volunteered.

Opening and Closing of Church for Services: A procedure has been developed but still needs to determine who is going to handle responsibility.

New Business:

ELCA Mission Investment Funds CD- Maturing on March 20th.

Finance Committee recommends renewing for (1) year at 4.15% APR. Also, (1) year term for the CD coming due in April

A motion was made to renew both CDs for (1) year period, Motion by Mark Mariano, second by Joan Rizzo, approved by Council.

2025 Mutual Ministry appointments: Pastor Brommer recommended that Joan Rizzo and Nathan Paul be appointed for a second (3) year term.

A motion to approve recommendation was made by JoEllen Myers, second by Mark Mariano. Motion approved by Council.

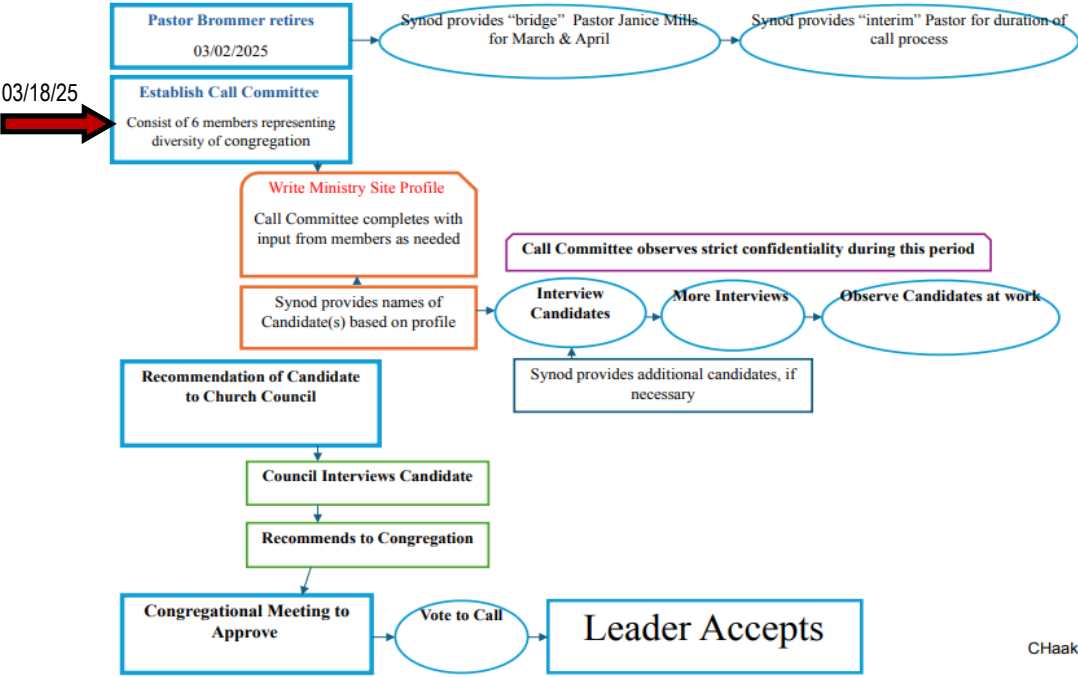
Next Council Meeting: March 18, 2025, @7pm via Zoom

At the March 18, 2025 Council meeting, the following members were approved to serve on the Call Committee:

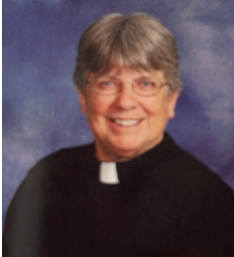

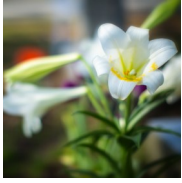

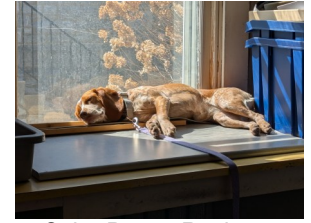

FAITH IN ACTION PROJECT

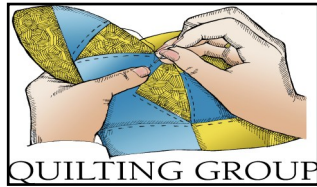

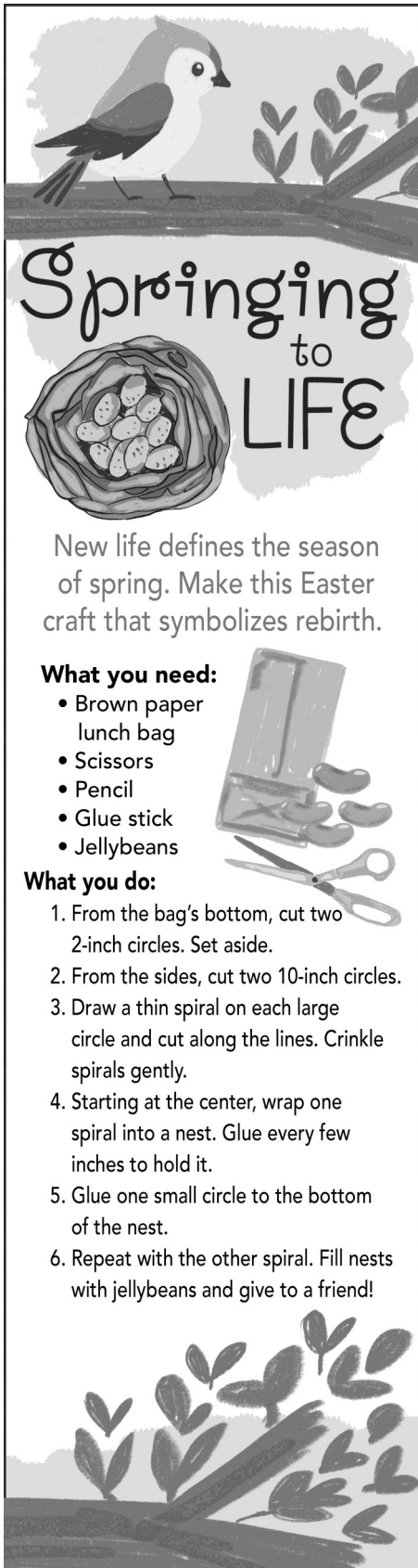
