Highlights--CONGREGATION COUNCIL MINUTES March 24, 2026

The Congregation Council Meeting was called to order at 7:00pm by President Rodney Gross

I. Reports:

- a. **Treasurer's Report:** Report for February was reviewed by Stephanie Gross. Net Loss was \$-2,134. Year to date our Net Income is \$1,340. Expenses were impacted by high utility bills for church and office.
- b. **Financial Secretary's Report:** The February report was included in the packet.
- c. **Secretary's Report:** Minutes from February 17, 2026, Council Meeting, and February 22, 2026, Annual meeting were included in the Council packet.
- d. **Pastor Carnes Time:** Report emailed prior to meeting.
 - i. Pastor added that she enjoyed participating and leading worship for the intergenerational retreat. She noted that many of the youth assisted the liturgy.
- e. **Correspondence:**
 - i. Love INC: thank you for \$750.00.
 - ii. Bethesda Mission: thank you for \$100.00.
- f. **Ministry Teams**
 - i. **Grow: Youth and Family Formation**
 1. Jonice provided an update on the Intergenerational Retreat which had 39 participants. There were several small group and individual sessions based on the theme "Prayer."
 - ii. **Witness:**
 1. **Faith In Action:**
 - a. Encouraged donations for the Personal Care Closet at Love INC.
 - b. Spring Highway clean-up will be April 11th.
 - iii. **Share:**
 1. **Finance Committee:** Chip Haak reported that Bryn Mawr Trust has suggested, and we agreed to separate our current two accounts into four accounts for better reporting. We will now have: Unrestricted Endowment, Restricted Endowment, Capital Repair Fund, and Stained-Glass Fund.
 2. **Property Committee:** Minutes of March 10, 2026, meeting were in the packet.
 - a. The glass replacement on the alley Stained Glass window will be done in the next few weeks.
 - b. Security cameras have been installed on the outside of the church, office, and inside in the North and South stair towers. Last step is getting an iPad for ushers to monitor during worship, and for office staff during the week. Several individuals will have an app on their phones.
 1. Chip stated that the cost was covered by an anonymous gift.
 - c. Committee is evaluating repairs to sidewalk on Cocoa Ave where locust tree has pushed it up.
 - d. 216 rental.
 1. Painting is finished, repairs to toilet are complete, still need to repair some lights and replace window blinds.
 2. The minor repairs to the wood floors will be done soon.
 3. **Extended Ministries:**
 - a. A request for \$1,000 donation to Love INC was approved by Council via email to assist with an emergency rent payment for disabled couple.

II. Unfinished Business:

- a. **Pastoral Transition Update**
 - i. Call Committee: All (4) interviews of candidates are complete. Starting second interviews with (3) candidates.
- b. **Live Streaming Media desk:** Installation is complete and it enhances our worship space. Thanks to Elizabeth Stuart who did the design of the desk, picked the stain color and coordinated the project with Country Lane Furniture. The cost will be covered from Bequested funds.
- c. **Synod Assembly Representatives:** June 5th & 6th, 2026
 - i. Jonice Storer and Mark Mariano will be our delegates.
- d. **Council review of Church Constitution:**

i. The revised Constitution and Bylaws were sent to Council members in February to review. They will vote on them at April meeting.

e. **Vacation Bible School:** Pastor Carnes stated that planning is underway.

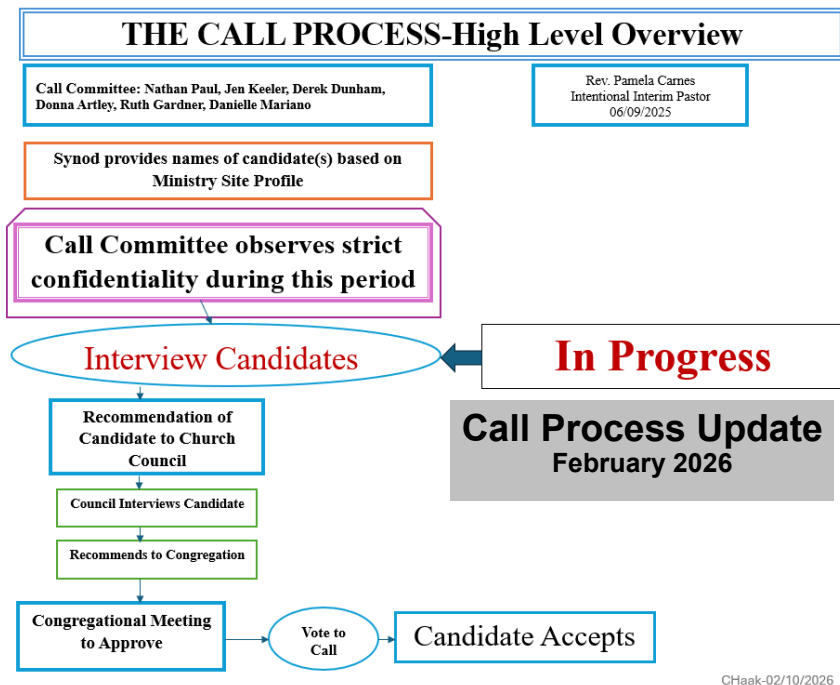
III. New Business:

YOUTH & FAMILY CORNER

Spring is finally here, and it truly feels like it. We're starting to get lots of warm days now. Now that May is here, things are beginning to slow down a little. We still have several events happening as we wrap up the HTY and Family Fellowship season.

HTY has had a very strong season this year, and things have been going great. The group continues to grow—each HTY night, we've had around 18 youth attending. This shows that our youth are not only coming out, but also bringing friends. Our HTY nights have been strong in every way, and the group is becoming closer and more connected.

Likewise, the fellowship events have been going very well. We continue to see our regular families, and we've also welcomed some new faces from time to time, which is always encouraging. As I mentioned last month, we even had our largest Family Fellowship retreat to date, filling the retreat center at Kirchenwald. In other words, it's been a healthy and successful year so far on both fronts.

Since we last connected a month ago, there have been several events to keep everyone engaged.

First, we had an HTY Night, which went great! Three advisors and 18 youth attended this evening of faith, fun, and fellowship. We continued our "Jesus" theme for the year, focusing on "Jesus the Servant." The night centered on the powerful example of how Jesus served others in all He did. Throughout the evening, we explored ways we can better serve others in all aspects of our lives, including within the church. With this encouragement, we hope to see more youth serving in the future. This HTY Night was another strong one.

Second, we held our annual HTY Sleepover. Again, three advisors and 18 youth participated. This event focused on fun and fellowship. We played lots of energetic youth group games, enjoyed late-night pizza, and then played even more games. Eventually, we settled down and caught a few hours of sleep. This event provided a great opportunity for deeper connection, which can be harder to achieve during a typical two-and-a-half-hour HTY Night. As a result, meaningful bonding took place, which is always a positive. All in all, this event was a blast!

Third, as the season comes to a close, plans are underway for a handful of summer events to help keep our youth families connected throughout the summer months. I intentionally plan fewer events during this time for two reasons. First, it allows both me and the advisors to rest and prepare for a busy fall season. Second, many families take well-deserved vacations, and our youth are often busy with camps and other summer activities.

Looking ahead, stay tuned to next month's Youth Corner for updates on plans for the upcoming season, including a change in my focus and role.

Well, that's all for now. I'm off to plan an "Affirmation of Baptism" class for this Sunday.

Outreach Ministries



Introducing ALICE—LoveINC

In 2023, according to the Federal Poverty Level (FPL), 12% of Pennsylvania households were financially insecure. Yet this measure failed to account for an additional 28% of households that were also experiencing financial hardship. These households are **ALICE**:

Asset Limited, **I**ncome **C**onstrained, **E**mployed — with income above the FPL, but not enough to afford basic expenses in the county where they live.

Between ALICE households and those living in poverty, an estimated 40% of households in Pennsylvania were below the ALICE Threshold in 2023.

They are the hands that care for our children and the faces that greet us in doctor’s offices, restaurants, and at the grocery store. For ALICE households in our community, hard work doesn’t always equal financial security. While they earn too much to receive government aid, they earn too little to survive the rising costs in Hershey and Hummelstown. These families aren’t just living paycheck to paycheck; they are living one flat tire or dental emergency away from financial crisis.

At Love INC, we believe no neighbor should have to face that disaster alone. While the numbers are sobering, our mission is to help the 40% of households in our area who either live below the Federal Poverty Level or those who are working hard, but still struggle each month as ALICE families. By mobilizing local churches and resources, we provide the practical support that keeps a “minor emergency”; from becoming a life-altering crisis.

One way to show our support for these ALICE households is by contributing to Love, Inc.’s Personal Care Closet.

EXTENDED MINISTRIES

The Extended Ministries Committee is responsible for recommending programs to the Congregation Council for approval for funding from the Endowment Fund. Yearly giving is established by the Congregation Council, and all church members can request funding for programs thru the committee. The Extended Ministry Committee recommends programs that are local to greater Hershey, the global community and within our own church community. If you would like to make a request, forms are in the wall organizer at the bottom of the backstairs. The form can be dropped off in the church office. This month, the Congregation Council approved the following:

\$500 from Extended Ministries to support the Holy Trinity quilters. The quilters lovingly assemble about 80-100 quilts every year for Lutheran World Relief. Those quilts are sent in many different directions but sometimes go overseas or are distributed in the United States for victims of natural disasters. The quilters will use the \$500 to purchase batting that fills the quilts. Every batting order costs approximately \$200 and Extended Ministry dollars will help them to accomplish their mission for 2026.

\$500 from Extended Ministries to support LAMPa. LAMPa is a partnership of ELCA World Hunger and Pennsylvania Lutheran synods, agencies and institutions that lead us in the work of being public church together- shaping policy to address the root causes of hunger, poverty and injustice. 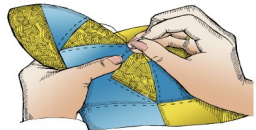
