NOTICE OF SPECIAL CONGREGATION MEETING

A letter from the Council President Rodney Gross has been sent via US mail to inform you of a special congregational meeting and vote. The meeting is scheduled for **Sunday, June 14, 2026 following the 10:00 AM worship service.**

The purpose of the meeting is to hold a vote to call a new pastor that has been recommended by the Call Committee and approved by Church Council. **Only voting members of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, Hershey will then be invited to vote.** Per our constitution, authority to call a pastor requires at least a two-thirds majority vote of voting members present and voting at a meeting legally called for that purpose.

The Congregation Council Meeting was called to order at 7:01pm by President Rodney Gross

Reports:

Treasurer's Report: Report for March was reviewed by Stephanie Gross. Net Loss was \$-12,295. Year to date our Net Loss is \$-10,895.

Expenses were impacted by property insurance and rental property taxes.

Quarterly reports included in the packet: Special Accounts, Youth Investment Fund, Rental Escrow account.

Pastor Carnes Time:

Report emailed prior to meeting. She noted we will be accepting as transferring members Sarah, Jason, and Carolyn Hancock on Sunday, April 26, 2026. **A motion** to approve for membership was made by Jen Keeler, second by Mark Mariano. Council approved.

She will present three candidates for Affirmation of Baptism at the May meeting.

Correspondence: Love INC: thank you for \$1,000; Lutheran World Relief: thank you for \$1,000; Carol Longenecker: thank you for Altar flowers.

Ministry Teams

Grow:

Youth and Family Formation Jonice Storer provided an update on the April 10th youth sleepover which was attended by 18 youth.

Witness:

Faith In Action: Funded from FIA account: \$250 in Giant gift cards donated to G2:10 on March 31st; \$400 in gift cards donated to Veterans Outreach of PA (Tiny Houses for Veterans); Spring Adopt-a-Highway clean-up was April 11th with (9) members participating.

Share:

Finance: Included in the Council packets were reports from Bryn Mawr Trust for Unrestricted Endowment:\$855,940, Restricted Endowment:\$45,317; Capital Repair Fund:\$66,012, and Stained-Glass Fund:\$39,362. Also report from ELCA Mission Investments Fund:\$36,352.

Property Committee: Minutes of March 14, 2026, meeting were in the packet.

Chip Haak added that a review was done of the "key log," individuals who have keys to church and office. It will need to be updated for the Boy Scout leadership who use the church for meetings.

Extended Ministries Committee recommendations:

\$500-for LAMPa, --a partnership of ELCA World Hunger and Pennsylvania Lutheran synods, agencies and institutions that leads us in the work of being public church together-shaping policy to address the root causes of hunger, poverty, and injustice.

\$500-for Holy Trinity Quilters to purchase batting to fill the quilts they make.

A motion was made to approve recommendations by JoEllen Myers, second by Beth Dunham. Council approved.

Council review of Church Constitution:

The revised Constitution has been available for Council members to review since early February. It was updated with actions taken at the 2022 and 2025 ELCA assemblies.

A motion was made by Sydney Keeler, second by Mark Mariano to approve the revised Constitution. Approved by Council.

New Business:

IT Policy: The document was circulated to members prior to meeting, The purpose of this policy is to ensure that all church computer systems, email services, and network resources are used appropriately, securely, and in a manner that supports the mission and ministry of the church.

A motion was made by Mark Mariano to approve policy. Second by Tess Mariano and approved by Council.

Next Council Meeting: May 19th , 2026 at 7pm via Zoom

Adjournment: A motion to adjourn by Mark Mariano and second by Jen Keeler, approved by Council. The meeting concluded at 8:09 pm with Lord's Prayer.

FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR CARNES

Dear Siblings in Christ, it will soon be summer and that means the end of school, the start of vacations, and much warmer weather, and long, beautiful days of bright sunshine and shorter nights. As of June 9th I will have been with you for one year, and honestly, I don't know where the time has gone. This has been a wonderful year for me as your intentional interim pastor. I am grateful to all of you, and for all of you. I have experienced such openness and kindness. Your hospitable and welcoming spirit invited me in to be with you.

Your receptiveness to my ministry and the gifts that I had to offer to you were graciously received and appreciated. Because of your acceptance of my presence and my ministry to and with you, together, we were able to keep the ministry of Holy Trinity moving forward, while you are waiting to find a new pastor.

An intentional interim pastor is not simply a place holder until the new pastor arrives. Intentional interim pastors help the congregation to move forward, by changing schedules, trying new approaches to programs, restoring traditions and practices that were lost, such as the offertory procession with the bread and wine for holy communion. The reappearance of the Easter Vigil during Holy Week. I worked with the Director for Faith Formation and the VBS staff to think creatively about restructuring Vacation Bible School. As a result they came up with a new plan to meet the challenges of time schedules of the families and volunteers. The result was a day long school with two days of Bible stories, crafts, and songs rolled into one day instead of two evenings.

Getting to meet the folks on the visitation list was delightful. All those I visited were gracious and welcomed me, and it was a privilege to hear their life stories and their history and connection to the church. There are few things more precious than sharing holy communion with these elder saints. I am glad I was able to get to know them at least a little while I am here with you.

The children and youth have been friendly, respectful, and so pleasant to be with. The fact that I'm unfamiliar and new hasn't deterred them from engaging with me. Being in Sunday school with them has been great, and on the last Sunday of SCS I had the opportunity to teach almost all the students about the communion ware and vestments, and I gave them a handout. It was so much fun for me to share with them.

The staff has been super to work with: Alan Hair, Elizabeth Stuart, Peter Fox, Colleen Nielsen, Karen Klein, Anita Housman, Stephanie Gross, and Peg Huebner. Everyone works hard, uses their gifts generously, is dedicated to all of you, striving to do their very best in the ministries God has called them to serve among you. I cannot thank them enough for their patience, support, kindness, and understanding.

The congregation council is a group of outstanding leaders. They listen, they are open to new thoughts and ideas, and are willing to be flexible and to try the untried. They are faithful and prayerful seeking to follow Jesus and living by God's word. They, like the rest of the congregation, have been welcoming, supportive, gracious, and understanding. It has been a joy to work with them and to lead the congregation with them.

Thank you for all the conversations, for all the worship we have shared together, all the meetings we have attended together, and all the activities we have joined in together. It has been an incredible privilege to serve as your intentional interim pastor; what a great year we have had. I also know there are many, many more to come for you. God's richest blessing on all of you and your ministry.

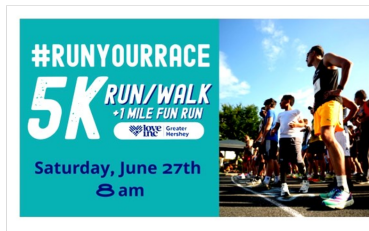
